To use at home alongside the video of the Sunday service

- Parts for you to join in at home are marked like this All
- Feel free to sit or stand as you wish.
 We have indicated the parts where it is customary to stand
- Making a Spiritual Communion

While we cannot meet in church it is not possible to receive holy communion. Instead, you can make what is called a spiritual communion.

It means that although you cannot receive the sacrament physically, you can receive Jesus as though you have. Spiritual Communion was defined by Saint Thomas Aquinas as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament, and a loving embrace as though we had already received him.

Remember that Jesus is not limited by time and space, and even though you cannot receive physically the consecrated bread and wine, Jesus will still come to you and give himself to you.

You may find it helpful to have a piece of bread and some wine ready to use when we reach the part of the service when we normally share communion. The bread and wine you have at home are not consecrated, but can be a helpful symbol as you make your Spiritual Communion

The president pronounces the absolution

Gloria in Excelsis

All Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.

The Lord be with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end of the gospel reading

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All Praise to you, O Christ.

Talk

It is customary to stand for the Creed The president says

Let us declare our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

The table is prepared and the president takes the bread and wine.

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation: through your goodness we have this wine to offer, fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become for us the cup of salvation.

The president says a special prayer over the gifts of bread and wine All respond

All Amen.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you

All and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

The president prays the Preface, a special prayer praising God

All join in the Sanctus and Benedictus

All Holy, holy, holy Lord,

God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

The president recalls the Last Supper as the bread and wine are blessed

Dear Lord Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you in my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there, and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

Prayer after Communion

After communion the president says a special prayer
